Having a health check

- the rights of your relative



If your relative has a learning disability, and is known to social services, they have the right to a health check.

The government has been paying doctors to do health checks for people with a learning disability, who are also known to social services. It pays doctors through a Directed Enhanced Service (DES).

You can ask the doctor who treats your relative with a learning disability if they are part of the DES, and if they can give your relative a health check. Even if your relative is not known to social services, you can still request a health check.

The law says that public services should make 'reasonable adjustments' so that people with disabilities can use them in the same way as others. We know that people with a learning disability often have unmet health needs that health checks can detect. So health checks are a reasonable adjustment GPs can make.

You can use this leaflet to help your relative get a health check. Just fill in the form and give it to the doctor who treats your relative.
