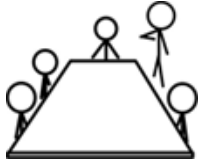


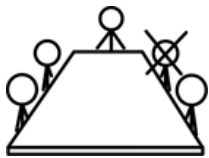


## Rutland Learning Disability Partnership Board Notes of Meeting held on Wednesday 12 February 2014

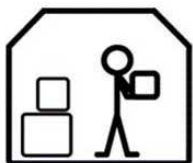

Work

Glynn showed us a monthly internet magazine called Touchbase which is written by The Department for Work & Pensions. It gives people news and information about their services. You can access this by googling 'Touchbase'.

Glynn also told us that the government is giving priority to finding employment and work experience for young people. At the next meeting we hope to talk more about this.



### **Hate and Mate Crime**

Darren Goddard gave us a presentation. He talked about hate crime and bullying. He also talked about mate crime and how people can pretend to be your friend and then use you instead of being a friend.

Darren reminded us to tell someone if these things happen, like a person in their family, a friend or support worker. They can also tell the police by ringing 999 (if it's an emergency) or 101 (if it's not an emergency) or they can go to a police station.

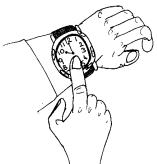
### **Better Health Action Plan**
